### Digital Literacies for Learning Developers - baselining report published

Following the ALDinHE's successful November 2011 bid to become one of the professional associations funded by JISC as part of its Developing Digital Literacies project, the project team undertook a baselining survey of digital literacy practices, training and attitudes for learning developers.

The main findings included:

- The popularity of digital technologies for creating teaching and learning resources, with some highly creative and innovative examples of good practice.
- The diversity of technologies and tools that are in use.
- That lack of time for training and exploration, and cost implications of equipment can mean that expertise becomes concentrated in a small number

of enthusiasts.

- Most learning developers were either self-taught when it came to using new technologies, or used informal training such as colleagues and friends (or, in one case, teenage children!).
- Relevance to LD work was the key motivator for learning new technologies.
- There were anxieties around the replacement of face-to-face teaching with digital resources, and difficulties in keeping up with new developments.
- Social media and mobile technologies were identified as areas where more guidance would be welcomed.

### Supporting our Students

#### What do we want? Academic Support for all!

As many ALDinHE members will have noticed, the National Union of Students (NUS) recently launched their *Charter on Academic Support*.

The ten-point Charter – which has been produced by Usman Ali (NUS Vice-President for Higher Education), and is available online ([click here](#)) should make welcome reading for learning developers.

Its recommendations include, for example:

- Prospective students to be provided with information about academic support provision, in order to 'help them make an informed decision about whether an institution meets their needs.'
- The need for induction to be an 'ongoing process throughout a student's time at university' and the need for students to be 'made aware of continuing support in place to help them' with managing the challenges HE learning can present.
- The provision of, and support for, peer-mentoring schemes to aid transition to, and integration into, life at university and learning in Higher Education.
- Support and recognition to 'be available for those who provide support to students' in order to ensure that services can develop, and that best practice can be shared across institutions.

More broadly, the Charter aims to place academic support at the heart of discussions about the future of Higher Education. As such, it's hugely relevant to our community of practitioners.

In recognition of this work, ALDinHE will be contacting Usman Ali, to welcome the publication of the Charter, and to express our broad support for its aims. We will also seek to

explore ways in which we and the NUS can work together to ensure that the issue of academic support is recognised and valued across the whole of the HE sector. Watch this space...

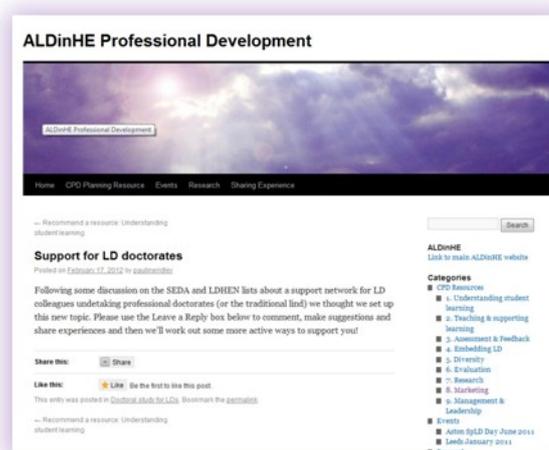
